Phonics

This week we would like Year 1 children to recap the following spelling patterns/rules. Practise these every day. Make up silly sentences or play games to remember them. Use them in sentences.

The sound "air" is often represented by the letters air.

The sound "ure" as in pure and sure.

"are" - In short words the most common way of spelling the sound /air/ is with the letters a-r-e.

The sound "tch" – as in match - the /ch/ sound immediately after a short vowel in a one syllable word.
