What are we learning in math's after the holiday (week commencing 3.6.19)?

Reception will be recognising numbers 20 to 100. We will also be solving problems by counting.

Year 1 will be starting the new half term working with money. We will learn to recognise the coins by colour, shape and value.

Year 2 will be continuing to revise all number bonds to and within 10 and use these to reason with and calculate bonds to and within 20, recognising other associated additive relationships (e.g. if 7 + 3 = 10, then 17 + 3 = 20; if 7 - 3 = 4, then 17 - 3 = 14).
