## **Can you spare a few hours a week to become a reading helper at our school?**

Our school is working with a charity called Coram Beanstalk to recruit volunteer reading helpers who can spare three hours a week to come in and work with some of our children on a one-to-one basis, giving those that need it extra support to practise reading skills outside of the classroom.

The aim of these sessions is to build up confidence, self-esteem and reading enjoyment in readers by ensuring activities are engaging and fun. This includes choosing books together, supporting the child to read the book and then discussing afterwards to ensure the child is improving their comprehension. Very importantly, the time reading helpers spend with the children is very different from time spent in the classroom and is more relaxed, informal and fun. As a result, children really look forward to them and reading becomes more enjoyable.

Coram Beanstalk recruits, trains and supports all our volunteer reading helpers. No experience or qualifications connected to working with children are required to become a reading helper. Coram Beanstalk just needs volunteers to have a passion for working with children to give them the best possible chance of improving their confidence and reading skills.
