## **Phonics**

This week we would like Year 1 children to recap the following spelling patterns/rules. Practise these every day. Make up silly sentences or play games to remember them. Use them in sentences.

The oy sound is used for those sounds at the end of words and at the end of syllables.

The sound 'ir' makes a similar noise to 'er'. Unlike 'er', 'ir' is often in the middle of letters

If words end in the oo sound ue and ew are more common spellings than oo English words do not end in U. Rather than using AU, they are each spelled with AW at the end of the word. AW can also be in the middle of words.
