

Phonics

This week we would like Year 1 children to recap the following spelling patterns/rules. Practise these every day. Make up silly sentences or play games to remember them. Use them in sentences.

A split digraph is a digraph that is split by a consonant. Usually a long vowel sound, e.g. 'a-e' (cake), 'i-e' (five), 'o-e' (code), 'e-e' (sphere) and 'u-e' (rule).

This week are looking at a-e, e-e, i-e and o-e
