### What are we learning in math's next week (week commencing 27.1.20)?

Reception will be looking at height and learning the terms tall and short. We will be measuring objects and each other by the length and height.

Year 1 will be using everything we have learnt over the last few weeks. The children will explore addition and subtraction fact families for numbers within 20. For example  $17 = 10 + 7$  or  $17 = 7 + 10$  or  $17 - 10 = 7$  and  $17 - 7 = 10$ . They should also understand that addition and subtraction sums are the opposite and that an addition will always have an answer of more and subtraction will not.

Year 2 will be beginning to learn and recall the division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables to solve simple problems e.g. sharing 40 cherries between 10 people and writing  $40 \div 10 = 4$ .



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
