What are we learning in math's next week (week commencing 11.2.19)?

Year 1 will be solving problems about length and height using words like long/short, longer/shorter, tall/short, double/half. They will measure and begin to record lengths and heights.

Year 2 will be learning to solve practical division problems (sharing, grouping) e.g. sharing 40 cherries between 10 people and writing $40 \div 10 = 4$.
